## **Enrolment at Emmaus**

### **Preschool**

Adopting a Reggio Emilia approach, Emmaus Preschool is a very special place offering 3 and 4 year-old children their first experience of engaging, enjoyable and exciting play-based learning. With a beautifully landscaped, hands on, natural environment, this provides them with a holistic preparation for school and a seamless transition to Kindergarten.

## **Primary School**

Emmaus Primary school offers a focused introduction to formal learning through Junior Primary (Kindy to Year 2). The learning program is centred around a strong literacy & numeracy program, extending into Upper Primary (Years 3-5) providing students with the best possible start to their life of learning; academically, socially, and spiritually.

## **Secondary School**

Secondary begins at Year 6 and with a broader subject offering. In Years 9-10 this continues to include a strong core subject base (Science Technology, English, Mathematics), elective streams and a varied vocational offering driven exploration. This is supported with a focus on matters pertaining to a Christin worldview and its implications on life in this world. Our new strategic plan includes exploring pathways for Emmaus students to access Years 11 & 12.

Emmaus is a member of the Association of Independent Schools ACT and Christian Education national.

- We are a supportive Christian community where parents and teachers partner to support the flourishing of children and young people.
- We address student concerns whether it be arguments and disputes, feelings of injustice or friendship issues, through dedicated pastoral care restorative practices.
- Our School develops a child's social skills using a Positive Education approach, The Friendzy Friend and Seasons for Growth programs, and our Buddies program.
- Our Middle and Senior Schools focus on building confidence alongside excellence and success.

#### Our context

Our school was founded by parents in 1997. Emmaus Christian School provides a unique, alternative educational experience for our students and their parents and carers. It is an offering grounded in Christian beliefs and values that we continue to live by.

Emmaus is a growing school. We have 660 students and two classes per year group. We continue to build on the momentum of the previous plan. At the same time, new challenges have emerged bringing with them new opportunities.

We can face the future confidently. We are an established school with a strong culture and a committed community.

#### Who we are and what we do

Emmaus is an inclusive school for everyone, where we work together with students and their parents and carers to:

- · develop a lifelong passion for learning;
- · help students progress their academic success; and
- create a culture of care, partnership and serving others.

We have some of the best teachers in Canberra who, together with parents and carers, develop students who live out their Christian values and become Australia's leaders for tomorrow.

### A commitment to Christ-centred education

A commitment to delivering Christ-centred education permeates all aspects of our community. It informs our daily activities and practices and especially the design of our teaching curriculum. Board directors are elected by full members of the company.

Christian parents who subscribe to the school's Statement of Faith and can provide a pastoral reference from their church are eligible to apply for full company membership. All parents are by default associate (non-voting) members of the company.

- This will register your child's name for the waiting list. Applying for the waiting list does not guarantee enrolment.
- Our main intake is 3 Year Old Preschool and Kindergarten. Other year levels will
  only have intake if places become available when students move or transfer.

### Interview

Families on the waiting list will be contacted at various stages for the interview phase. Invitation to interview does not equate to an enrolment offer.

#### Offer of Enrolment

- An Offer of Enrolment is made subject to the interview and places being available.
- Orientation takes place in November with commencement of enrolment in the new academic year.
